Key points to remember around schools

6. Driving and parking safely near the school

School opening and closing hours are busy times for pedestrian and vehicular traffic outside the school.

Always take extra care in 40km/h school zones, which operate on gazetted school days.

Park safely even if it means walking further to the school gate.

Observe all parking signs. They are planned with children's safety in mind.

NEVER double park as it puts children at risk.

three-point turns.

Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.

Avoid parking across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park.

Using your school's drop off and pick up facility will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.

Avoid parking in or near the school bus bay.

8-930 AM Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child - they will learn from you. Slow down near the school crossing. At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor. Always park and turn legally around the school. Avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as U-turns and














with students learning a variety of skills that they will use throughout their schooling lives.


