Early Birds Visit Classrooms

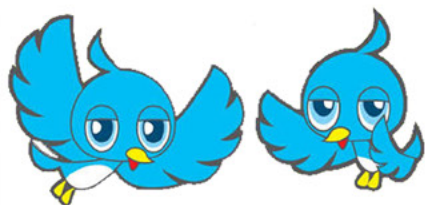

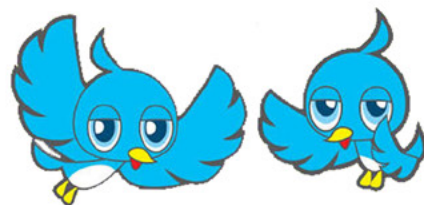

The Coonabarabran Public School Early Bird Program will commence on Monday 6th March & Tuesday 7th March 2017

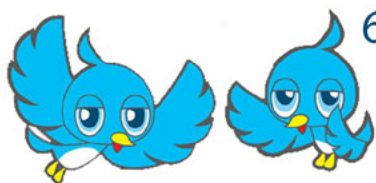
9 - 12 noon

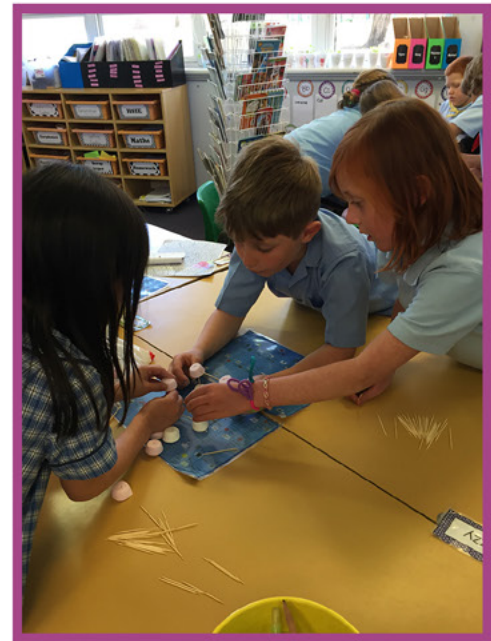
