I was lucky enough to be selected in the NW team to play in the State carnival in Tamworth in August. Thank you to our parents for taking the time to take us to Tamworth for the day.

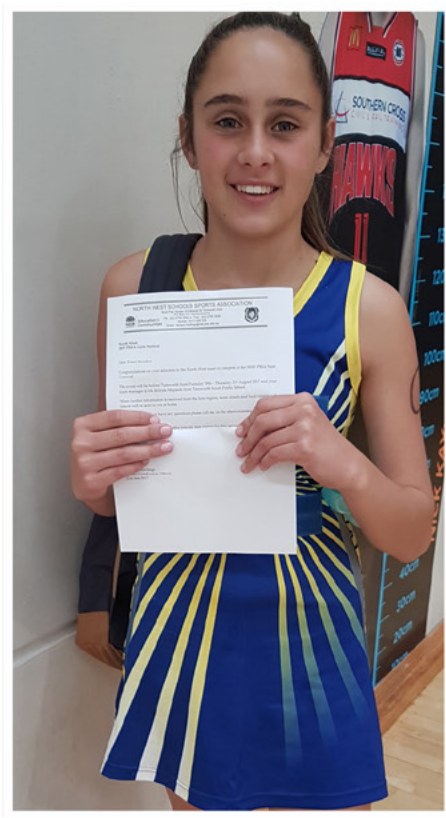

Meier's Magic Minute

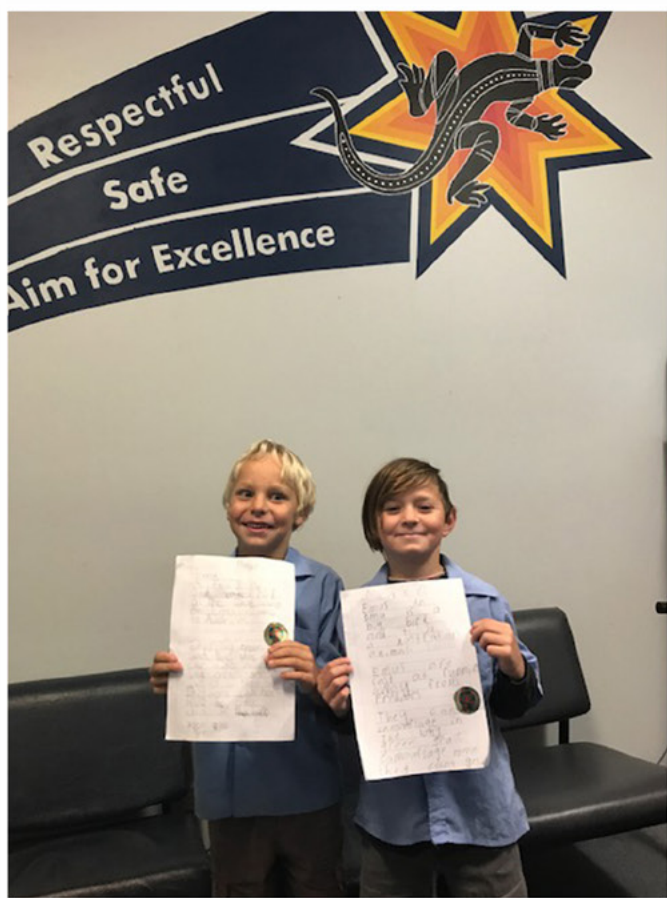
I would like to thank you for a wonderful term. It has been very busy and we have had some great successes. Many of our students have represented our school and district in sporting event which a fabulous achievement.

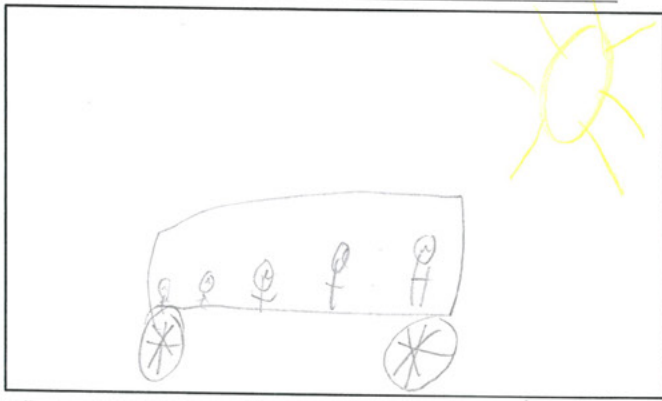
