We will be following the Early Years Learning Framework. There will be a curriculum followed each week in preparation for school readiness.

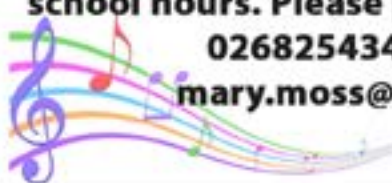

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

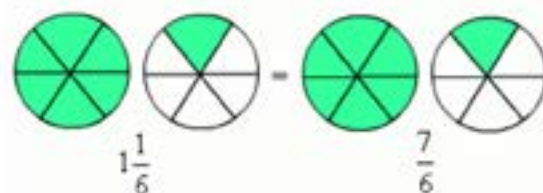
5/6K Class Focus
