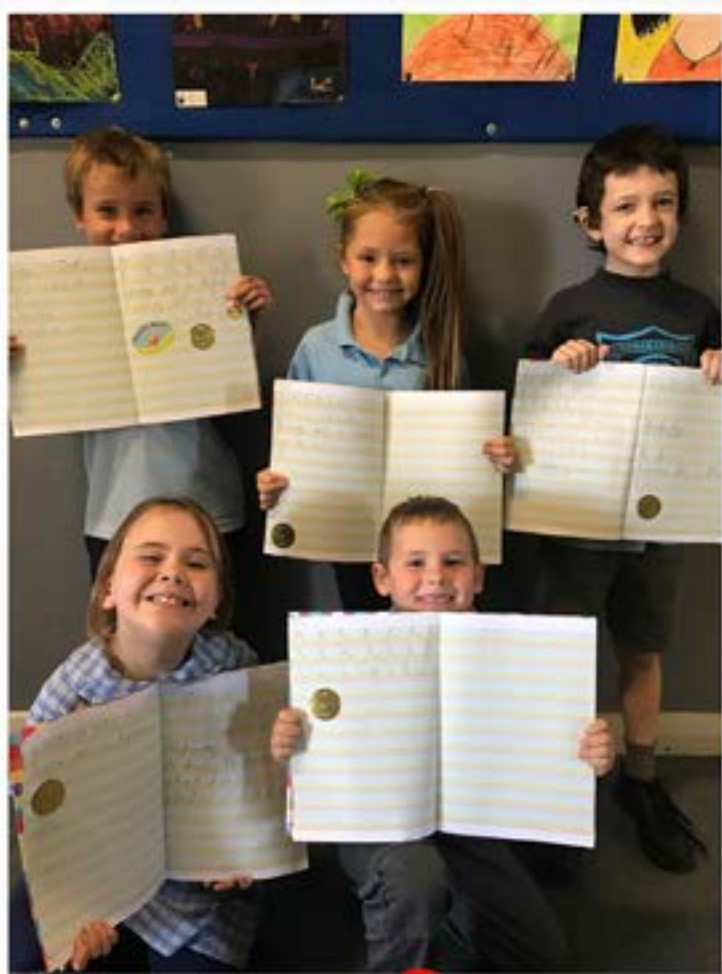

Infants Sports News

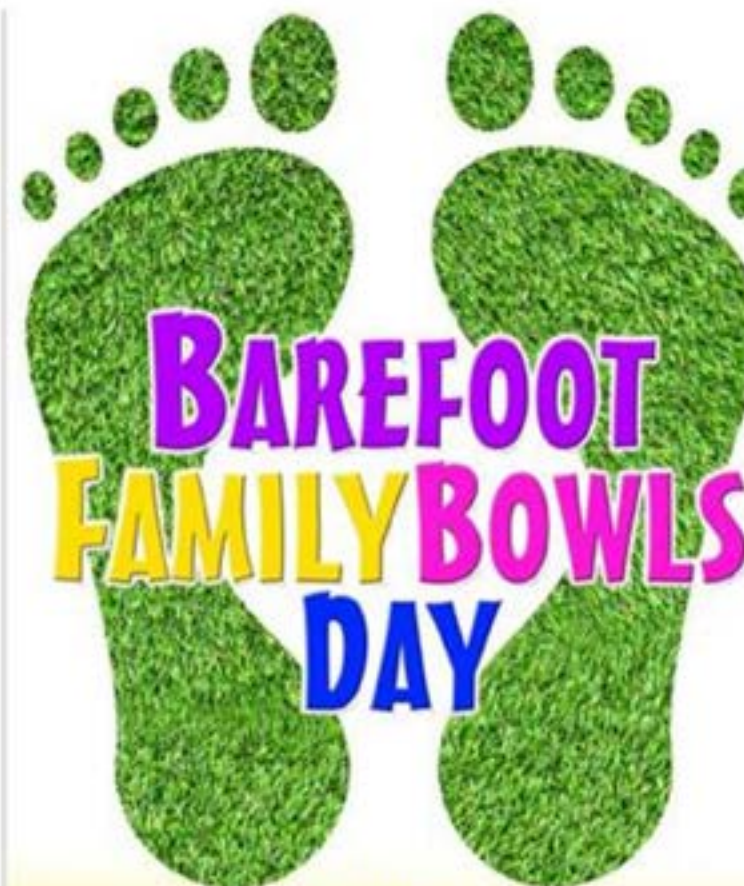
Our K-2 carnival will be on **Tuesday the 15th of May**. It will begin at 10am and will run until approximately 2pm at the High School oval.
