5/6I CLASS FOCUS

This term students are learning about micro-organisms in science and what they are, how they change things and what they do. To start off the unit this week students used their senses to look at different types of bread to see how they looked, felt, smelt and tasted and noted the difference in ingredients and how the ingredients affects the way the bread looks and feels. Students enjoyed eating the Turkish bread most of all because it reminded them of garlic bread followed by tortillas which was the only bread containing sugar and last but not least, the plain white bread which they decided they didn't like as much because it didn't have anything on it and tasted plain. Students noted that tortillas were the only bread not containing yeast and will be looking more into how yeast works in making bread. We started our word wall which will be added to throughout the unit as students develop an understanding of language used when learning science and what different technical terms mean.

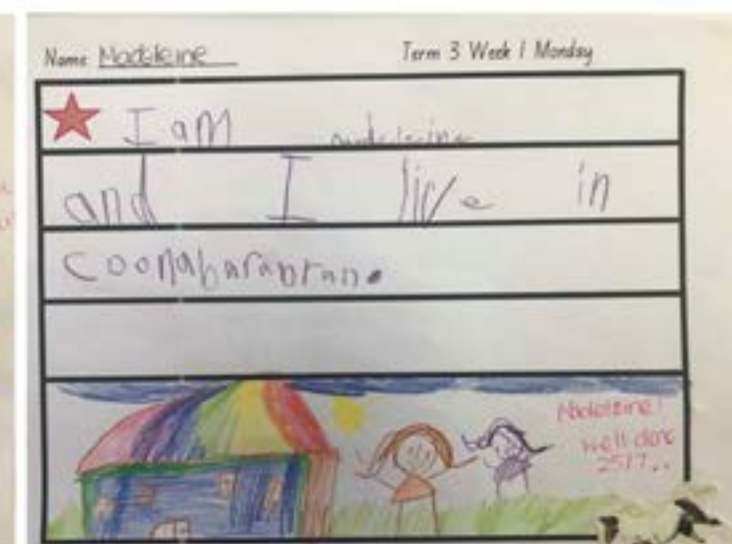
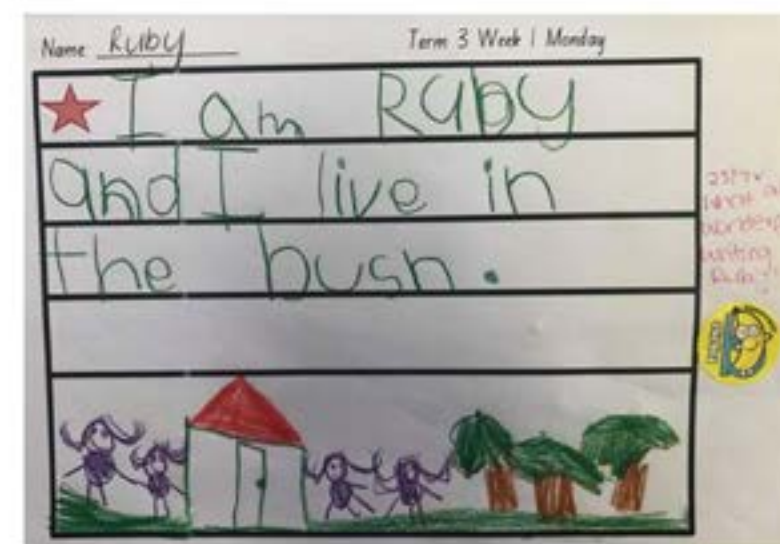
In literacy we are reading Storm Boy which is a fantastic text that engulfs students with visual imagery through the use of adjectives, similes and onomatopoeia. This text has a strong link to Aboriginal culture and students will be writing informative, imaginative texts and persuasive texts while reading this book and from their reactions to the text so far, will enjoy reading Storm Boy and completing this unit over the term. This unit flows nicely on after our writing completed last term where students wrote imaginative texts responding to visual or music stimulus, writing about what they would smell, feel, hear and see using onomatopoeia, adjectives and similes to produce quality texts that left the reader wanting to read more.

Art will be linked to our literacy unit and students have already produced some wonderful artworks using water colour paint and HB pencil this week and are looking forward to further developing their confidence and skills when completing art over the term. We have been busy learning our performance for PAN and are looking forward to performing this for our friends, family and community members in week 7 of this term.
