On Tuesday 16th August, a select group of boys from Stage 3 were lucky enough to travel with Mr Flynn & Carl down to the Castlereagh River on a fishing excursion. These students were invited to attend as they consistently display safe and respectful behaviours at school.

The excursion, organised by the NSW Fisheries, aimed at teaching students responsible fishing practices. Students were first led through responsible fishing and how important this is to maintain a healthy ecosystem and allowing recreational fishing to continue in the future. Daniel then taught the kids how to tie a simple clinch knot and how to properly cast a rod, rather than using the 'country cast'. It took some boys a few goes to move on from their tried and tested country cast but once they adopted the new techniques, they were able to cast more accurately with some target practice. We then had the opportunity to test our newfound knowledge in the river. Unfortunately, we did not manage to catch any fish but, we all had a good laugh at Jackson's last attempt at a cast! It ended up snagging in the tree 5 metres above his head, showing the downsides of the country cast.

Despite not catching any huge fish, the boy all had a wonderful day and even managed to leave with a few goodies such as hooks, sinkers and lures. Thanks to Daniel and the NSW Fisheries team for a wonderful day!




