

The first Red Reward was a great success and it was enjoyed by all the students, we can't wait for the next one to be held! Keep following our CPS PBL Values.
















4/5/6I Class Focus

MEDICAL, ACCIDENT & EMERGENCY INFORMATION

It is essential that we have an UP TO DATE emergency file for your child. If you change your address or telephone number, it is crucial to your child's wellbeing that you notify us immediately. In the event that you cannot be contacted, it is essential that we have at least one LOCAL emergency contact other than parents/guardians.

ACCIDENTS AND ILLNESS AT SCHOOL

Parents are asked to provide the school with a LOCAL emergency contact number so the school is able to contact someone in case of an accident or if your child is unwell during school. In case of serious accidents we notify parents by telephone and if we are unable to make contact we wll notify your emergency contact before seeking medical assistance. If you are unavailable, appropriate action will be taken in your absence, including calling an ambulance when necessary.

Parents are asked to advise us immediatley of any changes in their own or contacts addresses or telephone numbers.

If your child is unwell please keep him or her home. If your child becomes ill at school, we will make every effort to contact you or your emergency contact, to take the child home.

Allergies and anaphylaxis

Allergies

Allergies occur when an overactive immune system produces antibodies (IgE) against substances in the environment (allergens) that are usually harmless. However, exposure to an allergen can result in symptoms that vary from a mild to life-threatening sudden reaction.

Anaphylaxis

Anaphylaxis is a severe and sudden allergic reaction. It can occur when a susceptible person is exposed to an allergen (such as certain foods or an insect sting). Reactions usually begin within minutes of exposure and can progress rapidly over a period of up to two hours or more. Anaphylaxis is potentially life-threatening and always requires an emergency response.
