5/6L WEEC Film Production




5/6L were given a special opportunity to work with Wes Leedham and Ange Bunner from the Warrumbungle Environmental Education Centre (WEEC) in Week 5. Our goal was for students to produce a short 90 second film promoting tourism in the Warrumbungle National Park. We analysed real advertisments, looking at filming and storytelling techniques, framing, lightning and sound to help inform students about the considerations required to put together a storyboard. Students worked in teams of three, each with specific roles to do with production, creative directing and managing technology. Students found it quite challenging to put together a detailed storyboard, which was used to guide filming on Thursday.

We enjoyed beautiful weather in the valleys, following the nature trails to find locations and scenes to film and take photos. We also visited Siding Spring Trig Station for fantastic views of the Warrumbungles and put up with the icy cold winds coming from the south.

Our week ended on Friday with lessons about editing our films using iMovie on iPad's and a preliminary viewing of each team's progress before lunch. We hope to have a few more sessions to fine tune our films, taking on the feedback given on Friday. It was a terrific week learning about techniques, while enjoying our local National Park with our best mates and friends.

I wish to thank each 5/6L student who came along, being respectful to each other and the staff, acting safely while in the park and aiming for excellence by pouring all their effort and creativity to produce short films that would make us proud. 



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
